WIND FARMS-Stonechest, Black Knors and Moss Grove

Banks Renewables Ltd (previously 'Developments') have said recently that while they await the outcome of the Ministry of Defence review of wind farm developments in the vicinity of Eskdalemuir seismological recording station they want to continue to survey the proposed wind farm sites and to model wind speeds while doing this.

The Company plans to submit planning applications to erect single masts each of 80m tall and a few inches in diameter with supporting guy ropes at the sites at Black Knors and Moss Grove. The information gathered at Black Knors will be used to model both that site and Stonechest because of their close proximity. It is likely that a public meeting will be called to allow Parish Councillors to get the view of residents.

Broadband

The survey reported in the last issue of the Gill has found that nearly three quarters of rural Carlisle has patchy and often nonexistent broadband. Things have got to improve.

Using funds from "NW Together We Can" and working with Cybermoor, the Carlisle Parish Councils Association will build on work done so far. "This will look at practical steps to improve broadband in the home, stimulate demand to encourage investment by service providers, map the demand for faster services and examine the willingness to pay for the service."

Rory Stewart MP is at the forefront of the Cumbria initiative and has already signed up 150 Champions for parishes across the County. Cumbria is to be one of 4 Broadband Pilots and it is hoped that the most sparsely populated constituency in England will be one of the first to develop superfast broadband. The Government has also recently announced that it wants to see "Superfast Broadband" available to 95% of the country, especially the rural areas by 2015. The idea is to create "Hubs" in each community that we would all connect to. The Cumbria pilots will no doubt give us a guide about what to expect.

But I don't have a computer and don't see the need for one either!" Increasingly food/goods ordering, further education, working from home and that all important contact with friends and relatives is encouraging more people to get a computer - the free internet "Skype" service allows us to see the grandchildren on the other side of the world. Getting us more involved

Involving us more in decisions affecting the quality of our lives is a major theme of the Government's Big Society vision. The Localism Bill about to go through Parliament contains proposals that would mean greater involvement in vetting planning applications and the opportunity for more volunteering. Funds could be earmarked through an "Big Society Bank" Parish Councils are expected to gain greater powers to make things happen locally. The new year is certainly full of promise!
