What does the Parish Council do?

The Parish Council is one of about 8500 Parish and Town Councils in England and it is the first of the three tiers of local government in the County.

The Council has a considerable number of powers (may do rather than must do) ranging from the provision of public seats, notice boards and litter bins to providing allotments, cemeteries and swimming pools. The Council supports local groups and activities and represents your views to other bodies

Importantly the Parish Council can raise a local precept or tax which is collected by the District Council. There is always reference to this on your Council tax invoice.

Each year the Council seeks further grants from the City and County Councils for the Parish Hall and projects in the parish. In 2004/05 the Council turned over about £20,000 of which the precept was £5000 - not bad for a small council serving about 400 people.

The Council holds an annual meeting, usually in May and five other meetings - all must be in public. Agendas include time for the public to have a say about any issue in the parish.



Elected in 2003 for 4 years the role of your Councillors is to represent your views and concerns to the Parish Council and to other public bodies. They are:-
