CRIME - PC Alasdair Wright reports -

"Crime is generally down but with a slight increase in theft from motor vehicles in the North Cumbria, usually due to items of value left on display. Commercial burglaries have risen with several happening in as many weeks. As always we encourage everyone to be vigilant and ring in about anything you deem suspicious - it's never a waste of time - yours or ours! As an area we are pretty lucky but anything which helps deter thieves has to be good and Neighbourhood Watch as well as Farmwatch along with Smart water protection is a great deterrent which is known to work. We utilise 'voice-connect' to pass on significant information which can be received by landline, mobile, text or email so it ensures those in the scheme will get the message!"

There was a poor response to the Parish Council's call for comment on the recent review. Some residents did come along to the January meeting and the Council was able to make the following comments:-

Whilst public apathy has undermined bus service use, there should be no further reduction of bus services to Hethersgill. Journey timetables should be sensitive to those who travel to Carlisle and Brampton to work. This would mean alteration in current journey timetables and maybe routes. Residents would be reassured sufficiently to use the service again.

That acknowledgement be given to live/work businesses in the parish that rely on people using public transport to reach Hethersgill.

- The police will be checking traffic speed at Moss Edge
- The damage to the C1005 by HGV's and potholes on roads around the Parish were the subject a plea for action to County Cllr John Mallinson. Little money is going to be available in 2009 but he has been able to help with getting some immediate repair work done - thanks John
- Many people have commented about the tidiness of the crossroads area at Hethersgill and a contract has now been arranged to cover grass cutting and tidying shrubs. Have you noticed the new salt bin!
- Grants have been received from the City and County Council towards the Supper Room project and extra bids are being made to a number of other bodies. Thanks to colleagues in the principal authorities for the help.

- The condition of the recycling bins at the Parish Hall has been reported to the City Council. The lid to the paper bin will be replaced; the plastics bin repaired and the damaged cans bin will be replaced with a slightly larger container.
