Parish Hall - new supper room completed

Completion of the new Parish Hall supper room at a cost of £30,000 ends another tremendous fundraising project by the Parish Hall Committee to upgrade and extend the Hall.



The new supper room is 7m x 7m with its own direct access. Under floor heating, conference lighting and a bright appearance make for a great place to have



meetings, conferences and celebrations. The Hall Committee has raised over £9000 towards the cost and continues to fund raise for new chairs and tables. The chance has also been taken to paint the outside of the hall and tidy up the grounds.

The last 8 years has seen over £75,000 raised to fund reroofing, improvements to toilet facilities, fire and safety, a new kitchen and the supper room. The Parish Council together with the City and County Councils, the Hadfield Trust and Cumbria Waste Management have made significant contributions to add to the Hall Committee's own considerable fundraising efforts. City Cllr Jonathan Devlin and County Cllr John Mallinson have also given grants from their local funds.

A very big "Thankyou" is due to everyone involved.

Hethersgill Walking Group is going strong!

The programme is circulated twice a year in the Gill and walks also appear in the Benefice News. Most months we have two long walks and one short walk.

The short walks start at 1 p.m., are fairly local and up to about 5 miles in length over gentle terrain.

The long walks normally start at 9 a.m. and we get back about 5 p.m. The long walkers share cars to travel for up to about 1 hour away, which can take us into the Lake district, the Howgills, the Borders or the Pennines. The walks vary in length but demand some walking fitness. The grade appears on the programme and where marked strenuous, normally involves steep hill climbs or tussocky moorland. We even get tussocky moorland going uphill sometimes which delights some of our members. But we do stop for coffee and lunch, as well as frequent other stops "to admire the view" (this is walk leader speak for "getting your breath back").

The group has members (that is a bit posh because there is no fee; we are just a group friends walking at their own risk) from a wide area. Folks come from Dumfries, Annan, Longtown, Carlisle, Burgh-by-Sands, Laversdale, Brampton and of course Kirklinton and Hethersgill; so the fame of our village is spread across a wide area.

In March, the long walkers were to be found around Appleby and on the Caldbeck fells over High Pike and Carrock Fell, whilst in April we went from Croglin over to the New water of Gelt and back by Blotting Raise in gorgeous sunshine. The short walkers enjoyed a superb day around Lanercost again in the sunshine. I must point out that I cannot guarantee the weather, and on odd occasions we get wet and the Paramo trousers come in very handy.

U1082 Hetherbank near Hallfoot Mill – 17^{th} May – drainage improvement lasting two weeks. The road will be closed and diversions will be in place.

Dacre Rd, Hethersgill adjacent to 1 The Mount - 21st-23rd June - repairs to inspection chambers in the road. Road closure is proposed and talks are taking place about access for emergency services.

C1005 near Prior House - road resurfacing - dates to be announced but road closure will be necessary

Netherfield pavement restoration between the Old Chapel and the Old School. Date to be announced but to be complete before October half term.
