BROADBAND

Do you run a business in the Parish? Small and medium size enterprises are being offered help to apply for £3,000 vouchers to spend on superfast broadband connections. To receive a voucher, businesses need a bespoke connection quotation or to take a pre-registered package from a registered supplier (IP River, at Kingmoor Park, Carlisle, is the only registered supplier in Cumbria). SAFETY AT THE CROSSROADS

Progress is being made with the proposed implementation of a 30 mile per hour zone around the Crossroads. Plans are still being formulated and formal consultation will be undertaken after the matter has been discussed by the County Council Local Committee, which was due to happen during September .

ONLINE SAFETY

Get Safe Online are launching a campaign targeting parents with advice on how to keep their children safe when gaming online. If you're like most parents, you'll have children who play games online, whether on a tablet, mobile, computer or console. In the majority of cases, online gaming is a fun and safe pastime — a way for kids to keep entertained and in many cases, play against and socialise with friends.

Some games also have an educational angle, helping to develop knowledge and strategies. However, as with many things your kids do online, there's an element of risk. This is because of the vast number of people in the UK and abroad who are also playing, the minimal restrictions involved and the fact that they're not face-to-face - so your child can't be sure who they are, or what their motives are. The risks include being taken advantage of by strangers with sexual, abusive, fraudulent or other criminal motives.

Apart from these, there's also the danger of playing games with an inappropriate age rating, running up huge bills on your credit card - if they have access to it - and getting 'hooked' to the exclusion of exercise, socialising and school work.


