At every meeting we have a **Public Participation** section on our agenda. This item allows you to bring any items that are of relevance in the Parish to the attention of your Parish and District Councillors.


## PRECEPT

You will be pleased to hear that we have kept our precept (the tax we levy annually) at the same level of £7,000. The precept has been at this level for a number of years now but despite rising costs and reduced funding available to us we have once again decided to maintain the level of monies requested.

As part of our precept we do offer a small grant scheme for community groups. Since the establishment of the Hallburn Wind Farm Grant Fund we do **require ALL parish based groups to apply to that fund first** but if you have a project you need support for please get in touch with the Clerk for more information on our limited grant pot.

## HALLBURN WIND FARM GRANTS

Asides from the money allocated to the Parish Council for our new website, grant funds have been allocated to 9 other groups in the local area in the first round of grants allocated.



Sadly none of the groups to benefit were from the parish of Hethersgill but we hope community groups in our parish will be encouraged to apply for the second round.

Funds have been used to support projects such as a **senior citizens Christmas party**, renovations to a bowling club house and an extension to the **Arthuret church yard**.

### EMERGENCY PLANNING LEAFLETS

We have enclosed for you along with this newsletter an Emergency Planning Leaflet.

ACTion with Communities in Cumbria (ACT) is encouraging households across the county to consider what local risks may affect them and how to be better prepared.

The leaflet includes practical suggestions for: having a plan; what to put in an emergency 'grab bag'; how to stay informed; and responding to an incident.

This work is part of 'Rebuilding Together', a three year BIG Lottery funded programme to build the resilience of people, communities, and organisations in Cumbria, helping them prepare for events similar to the devastating floods of December 2015. The programme is led by Cumbria CVS and delivered in partnership with ACT and Cumbria Action for Sustainability (CAFS).
