CHAIRMAN'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Parish Council has had a busy and productive twelve months, primarily in support of some wonderful community projects.

In my last annual report, I invited you to an open meeting, which we held on 12 April 2022. We were delighted with the turnout, with well over 50 people coming along to discuss how to improve our community to foster a greater sense of community spirit. We also handed out our "Householder Pack" and have spare copies still available for any new residents.

Since April 2022, I am pleased to share that the Social Committee have been successful in setting up many events, such as flower and basket weaving classes, yoga, and film nights. We are pleased to be able to support these events and initiatives where we can. Many thanks to Cllr Marti Irving and the Social Committee for their on-going work.

Our "Balsam Bashers" also continue to do sterling work in removing the non-native plant from our parish; thanks to Christine Williams, Tony Gash and Gill Houston as well as their team of volunteers.

We also held two very well attended first aid training courses; more on those later in the newsletter but my sincere thanks to Christina from Appleby First Responders for running the sessions for us. We have recently had the results of our uncontested parish council election and I'm pleased to share with you later in this newsletter the members who will make up our Council going forward for the next four years. We have said goodbye with the greatest of wishes to Tony Gash and Ann Oswin and we wish them well in their future endeavours. This does mean we have some vacancies on the Council; if you are interested in standing for one of these, please do get in touch. My sincere thanks to our remaining parish councillors who continue to donate their time and efforts for our area.

We have had a change in our ward members since my last report, with the formation of the unitary Cumberland Council. This means that we will be dealing exclusively with ClIr John Mallinson going forward. John has been a long-standing attendee at our meetings and we look forward to continuing our working relationship with him.

As I always repeat in my report, please do remember that you are able to come along to parish council meetings. We are always very pleased to see members of the public in attendance.
